As we reflect upon our activities over the last year we can be very proud of everything achieved in 2022. Trondheim-Trøndelag and Menorca both successfully hosted the European Region of Gastronomy title in 2022 and have excelled in gaining international visibility. The World and European Regions of Gastronomy were mentioned in over 60 articles in international online media, including National Geographic, Lonely Planet, The Times, The Telegraph, The Independent, Forbes, Traveller and Euronews.

Moreover, the Award has contributed to them being selected as destinations for future international events, for example the Bocuse d'Or in Trondheim in 2024. Menorca now boasts a Hospitality Training Centre in Ca n'Agadet to improve the employability of adults at risk of social exclusion. The legacy lives on in both regions and their evaluation will be key for us all, especially as they are the first regions to celebrate the Award with large-scale citizen events since the pandemic. An external observation tells that they have experienced a stronger visitor comeback than in other regions in Europe, and the Award has been a cohesive factor across multiple sectors to build back better and more sustainably.

We now wish the best of luck to Hauts-de-France, a huge region with two distinct identities that begins their mandate as European Region of Gastronomy 2023. We hope the Award will help them build cohesion across the region and bring much deserved recognition for this first-class gastronomic destination. In 2023, IGCAT will for the first time organise the World Food Gift Challenge as a stand-alone event, hosted on the island of Kos by our trusted hosts from the South Aegean, European Region of Gastronomy since 2019.
